

46 | CONDITIONAL 1



Describes a possible future situation.



Present	Future
→ Simple	with will
If I <u>see</u> you tomorrow, I <u>will talk</u> to you.	

Future	Present
with will	→ Simple
I <u>will talk</u> to you if I <u>see</u> you tomorrow.	



If I don't have time tomorrow, I won't talk to you.



Will you talk to me if you have time tomorrow?
